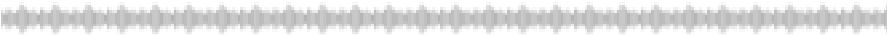

1. Registered Nurses

Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and implement nursing care plans, and maintain medical records. Administer nursing care to ill, injured, convalescent, or disabled patients. May advise patients on health maintenance and disease prevention or provide case management. Licensing or registration required. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$32.66 to \$45.62 per hour.

2. Nursing Assistants

Provide basic patient care under direction of nursing staff. Perform duties such as feed, bathe, dress, groom, or move patients, or change linens. May transfer or transport patients. Includes nursing care attendants, nursing aides, and nursing attendants. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$14.90 to \$19.29 per hour.

3. First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers

Directly supervise and coordinate activities of retail sales workers in an establishment or department. Duties may include management functions, such as purchasing, budgeting, accounting, and personnel work, in addition to supervisory duties. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$16.99 to \$27.07 per hour.

4. Retail Salespersons

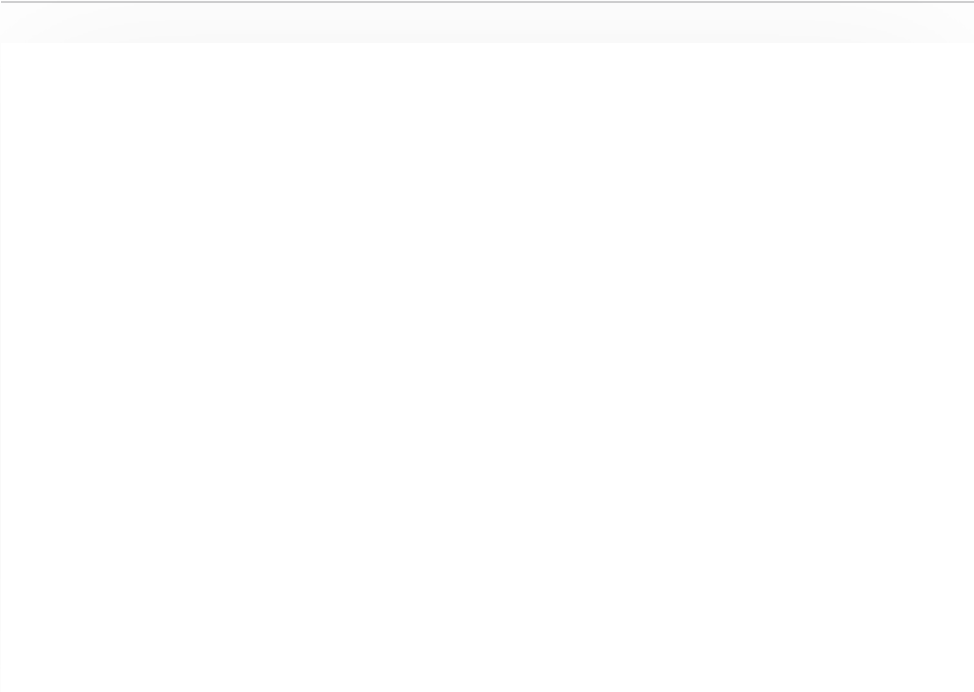
Sell merchandise, such as furniture, motor vehicles, appliances, or apparel to consumers. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$11.34 to \$16.02 per hour.

5. Personal Care Aides

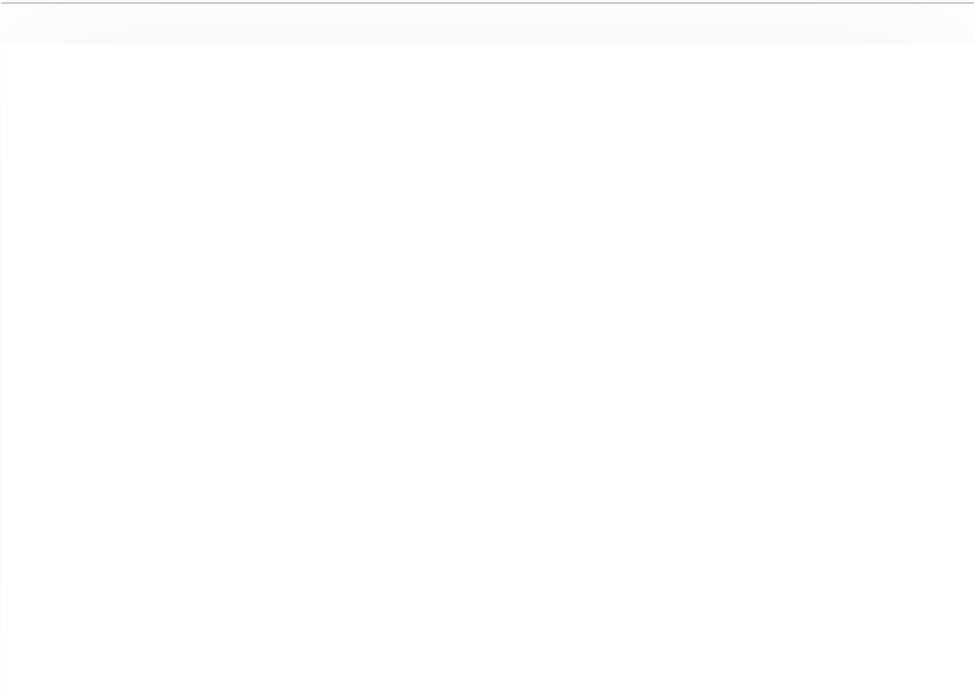
Assist the elderly, convalescents, or persons with disabilities with daily living activities at the person's home or in a care facility. Duties performed at a place of residence may include keeping house (making beds, doing laundry, washing dishes) and preparing meals. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$12.27 to \$15.21 per hour.

6. Combined Food Preparation and Serving Workers, Including Fast Food

Perform duties which combine preparing and serving food and nonalcoholic beverages. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$10.87 to \$13.43 per hour.

7. Social and Human Service Assistants

Assist in providing client services in a wide variety of fields, such as psychology, rehabilitation, or social work, including support for families. May assist clients in identifying and obtaining available benefits and social and community services. May assist social workers with developing, organizing, and conducting programs to prevent and resolve problems relevant to substance abuse, human relationships, rehabilitation, or dependent care. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$14.49 to \$21.40 per hour

8. Customer Service Representatives

Interact with customers to provide information in response to inquiries about products and services and to handle and resolve complaints. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$15.71 to \$24.03 per hour

9. Licensed Practical and Licensed Vocational Nurses

Care for ill, injured, or convalescing patients or persons with disabilities in hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, private homes, group homes, and similar institutions. May work under the supervision of a registered nurse. Licensing required. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$20.91 to \$26.60 per hour.

10. Home Health Aides

Provide routine individualized healthcare such as changing bandages and dressing wounds, and applying topical medications to the elderly, convalescents, or persons with disabilities at the patient's home or in a care facility. Monitor or report changes in health status. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$12.27 to \$15.21 per hour.

11. Helpers-Production Workers

Help production workers by performing duties requiring less skill. Duties include supplying or holding materials or tools, and cleaning work area and equipment. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$12.58 to \$17.90 per hour

12. Software Developers, Applications

Develop, create, and modify general computer applications software or specialized utility programs. Analyze user needs and develop software solutions. Design software or customize software for client use with the aim of optimizing operational efficiency. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$39.21 to \$61.09 per hour.

13. Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers

Drive a tractor-trailer combination or a truck with a capacity of at least 26,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW). May be required to unload truck. Requires commercial drivers' license. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$20.50 to \$28.76 per hour.

14. Light Truck or Delivery Services Drivers

Drive a light vehicle, such as a truck or van, with a capacity of less than 26,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW), primarily to deliver or pick up merchandise or to deliver packages. May load and unload vehicle. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$14.84 to \$24.76 per hour.

15. Cashiers

Receive and disburse money in establishments other than financial institutions. May use electronic scanners, cash registers, or related equipment. May process credit or debit card transactions and validate checks. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$11.10 to \$13.95 per hour.

16. First-Line Supervisors of Food Preparation and Serving Workers

Directly supervise and coordinate activities of workers engaged in preparing and serving food. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$15.12 to \$22.44 per hour.

17. Marketing Managers

Plan, direct, or coordinate marketing policies and programs, such as determining the demand for products and services offered by a firm and its competitors, and identify potential customers. Develop pricing strategies with the goal of maximizing the firm's profits or share of the market while ensuring the firm's customers are satisfied. Oversee product development or monitor trends that indicate the need for new products and services. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$50.96 to \$82.36 per hour.

18. First-Line Supervisors of Office and Administrative Support Workers

Directly supervise and coordinate the activities of clerical and administrative support workers. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$23.26 to \$36.49 per hour.

19. Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers, Hand

Manually move freight, stock, or other materials or perform other general labor. Includes all manual laborers not elsewhere classified. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$13.81 to \$20.64 per hour.

20. Stock Clerks, Sales Floor

Receive, store, and issue sales floor merchandise. Stock shelves, racks, cases, bins, and tables with merchandise and arrange merchandise displays to attract customers. May periodically take physical count of stock or check and mark merchandise. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$12.50 to \$18.31 per hour.

21. Medical Assistants

Perform administrative and certain clinical duties under the direction of a physician. Administrative duties may include scheduling appointments, maintaining medical records, billing, and coding information for insurance

purposes. Clinical duties may include taking and recording vital signs and medical histories, preparing patients for examination, drawing blood, and administering medications as directed by physician. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$17.80 to \$23.32 per hour.

22. Packaging and Filling Machine Operators and Tenders

Operate or tend machines to prepare industrial or consumer products for storage or shipment. Includes cannery workers who pack food products. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$14.11 to \$21.34 per hour.

23. First-Line Supervisors of Production and Operating Workers

Directly supervise and coordinate the activities of production and operating workers, such as inspectors, precision workers, machine setters and operators, assemblers, fabricators, and plant and system operators. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$26.00 to \$38.48 per hour.

24. Management Analysts

Conduct organizational studies and evaluations, design systems and procedures, conduct work simplification and measurement studies, and prepare operations and procedures manuals to assist management in operating more efficiently and effectively. Includes program analysts and management consultants. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$31.05 to \$50.46 per hour.

25. Maintenance and Repair Workers, General

Perform work involving the skills of two or more maintenance or craft occupations to keep machines, mechanical equipment, or the structure of an establishment in repair. Duties may involve pipe fitting; boiler making; insulating; welding; machining; carpentry; repairing electrical or mechanical equipment; installing, aligning, and balancing new equipment; and repairing buildings, floors, or stairs. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$17.48 to \$26.97 per hour.

26. Food Service Managers

Plan, direct, or coordinate activities of an organization or department that serves food and beverages. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn \$22.28 to \$34.12 per hour.

27. Janitors and Cleaners, Except Maids and Housekeeping Cleaners

Keep buildings in clean and orderly condition. Perform heavy cleaning duties, such as cleaning floors, shampooing rugs, washing walls and glass, and removing rubbish. Duties may include tending furnace and boiler, performing routine maintenance activities, notifying management of need for repairs, and cleaning snow or debris from sidewalk. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$12.73 to \$18.90 per hour.

28. Medical and Health Services Managers

Plan, direct, or coordinate medical and health services in hospitals, clinics, managed care organizations, public health agencies, or similar organizations. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$38.88 to

\$62.59 per hour.

29. Driver/Sales Workers

Drive truck or other vehicle over established routes or within an established territory and sell or deliver goods, such as food products, including restaurant take-out items, or pick up or deliver items such as commercial laundry. May also take orders, collect payment, or stock merchandise at point of delivery. Includes newspaper delivery drivers. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn \$11.16 to \$17.27 per hour.



Kerkez

30. Assemblers and Fabricators

Work as part of a team having responsibility for assembling an entire product or component of a product. Team assemblers can perform all tasks conducted by the team in the assembly process and rotate through all or most of them rather than being assigned to a specific task on a permanent basis. May participate in making management


decisions affecting the work. In Minnesota, people in this occupation tend to earn between \$14.04 to \$20.05 per hour.
